Center for Child and Family Services' Safe Harbor for Kids Program-Hampton	Safe Harbor for Kids will provide free assessments, supervised visits, and three required trauma informed parent sessions to increase attachment, knowledge of effects of trauma on children and affect regulation. Services will be available for custodial and non-custodial parents in Hampton, Newport News, York county, Isle of Wight and Williamsburg.
Children's Hospital of the King's Daughters (CHKD)- Norfolk	CHKD's Child Abuse Program is Hampton Roads' only comprehensive Child Advocacy Center, helping approximately 1,100 maltreated children and families each year. With support from FACT, the project will develop and implement a Comprehensive Family Advocacy program that prioritizes the utilization of individualized, trauma-sensitive services for survivors of child maltreatment. The service area covered include: Chesapeake, Hampton, Newport News, Norfolk, Portsmouth, Suffolk and Virginia Beach.
ChildSafe Center-CAC- Winchester	The ChildSafe Center will provide evidence-based therapy to children and their caretakers in the Valley region who have been victimized by family violence including child physical and sexual abuse, neglect and domestic violence. Treatment will focus on combating the symptoms caused by trauma and teaching healthy coping strategies. The service areas covered include: Winchester, Frederick, Shenandoah and Clark counties.
Christian Relief Services' Safe Places Transitional Housing Program- Alexandria	Safe Places Transitional Housing Program offers hope and support for women and their children through safe, affordable housing, victim advocacy, economic empowerment and strength-based case management for up to two years in 20 scattered sites throughout Fairfax County. Services focus on safety, financial management, maintained/increased income, and permanent housing.
Collins Center-Harrisonburg	The Collins Center will provide comprehensive trainings to educate 150 first responders to child sexual abuse in Harrisonburg and Rockingham County. Leaders of faith institutions, guidance counselors, refugee and immigrant advocates, and municipal law enforcement will utilize trauma-informed systems of care for a coordinated, community-wide approach to abuse disclosures.

Family Services of Roanoke Valley- Roanoke	Family Service’s Counseling programs serve up to 1,500 children, adults and older adults who are exposed to or at risk of being exposed to family violence across the Roanoke Valley. Through in-office, community and care facility based services, clients are identified and served regardless of ability to pay.
Foothills Child Advocacy Center- Charlottesville	Foothills Child Advocacy Center provides a culturally sensitive, trauma informed, coordinated system of effective response and intervention for alleged child victims of abuse and their non-offending caregivers in a child-friendly setting. Foothills coordinates the Charlottesville/Albemarle Multidisciplinary Team of 14 local agencies and assist other localities to serve 200-plus child victims annually. Services are provided for Charlottesville and Albemarle, Buckingham, Fluvanna, Greene, Louisa, Madison and Orange Counties.
Greater Richmond Stop Child Abuse Now (SCAN), Inc.- Richmond	The Trauma Informed Community Network (TICN) is a diverse group of professionals in the Greater Richmond area who are dedicated to supporting and advocating for continuous trauma informed care for all children and families within the Child Welfare system.
New River Valley Child Advocacy, Resources, Education and Services (NRV CARES)- Christiansburg	NRV CARES’ Parenting Young Children Program will offer 24 courses to 200 parents/caregivers of children age six and younger in Giles, Floyd, Montgomery, and Pulaski Counties and Radford City (Western Region). Participants, served through self/other referrals and partnerships with Head Start, Giles Health Network, and Virginia Preschool Initiative, are provided education and support to strengthen parenting skills.
The Up Center- Norfolk	The Up Center will create the Hampton Roads Trauma Informed Care Network (HRTICN) to include a network comprised of public and private providers who will collectively impact over 5,000 people in Norfolk, Chesapeake, Portsmouth, Virginia Beach and Suffolk. By facilitating training and action planning the HRTICN will increase awareness and practice of trauma informed care.
