James Madison University	Intensive trauma-informed home visiting services for 40-50 vulnerable parents and children in rural Page County whose adverse childhood experiences and depressed economic circumstances place them at increased risk of family violence. Educational and prevention services include screening and follow-up for partner violence, depression, substance use, parent/child interaction, and social-emotional development.
NRV Cares	NRV CARES' Parenting Young Children will offer 26 courses to 200 parents/caregivers of children age six and younger in Giles, Floyd, Montgomery, and Pulaski Counties and Radford City (Western Region). Participants are served through self/other referrals and partnerships with Head Start, Community Housing Partners, and the Women's Resource Center.
Center for Child & Family Services (Safe Harbor)	Safe Harbor for Kids will provide free assessments, supervised visits, and trauma informed sessions for parents to increase attachment, knowledge of effects of trauma on children and three community trainings on trauma. Services will be provided for Hampton, Newport News, Isle of Wight, and York County, custodial and non-custodial parents.
OAR Fairfax County	Trauma Informed Care training will be provided to OAR's Batterer Intervention Program facilitators. The program serves 150 adult men each year in Fairfax and Alexandria who have perpetrated domestic abuse. OAR will collaborate with Dr. Murphy at the University of Maryland to provide effective services to participants impacted by trauma.
Children's Trust of Roanoke Valley	Healthy Families Roanoke Valley will provide home visiting services, targeting child abuse and neglect prevention, to expectant mothers in Roanoke Valley served by Project Link. Offering trauma informed and responsive care for an estimated 20 high-risk mothers is the shared goal of this collaborative.

Childsafe Center CAC	Family Service's Counseling programs serve up to 1,500 children, adults and older adults who are exposed to or at risk of being exposed to family violence across the Roanoke Valley. Through in-office, community and care facility based services, clients are identified and served regardless of ability to pay.
VCU Health System	The Child Protection Team at CHoR and Empower who serves the adult sexual and domestic violence victims at VCU would provide a collaborative prevention/intervention trauma informed care family approach addressing teen dating violence, intimate partner violence, sexual abuse, and child abuse by utilizing screening tools for parents and children.
SARA	Serving the greater Charlottesville area, SARA will forge a partnership with staff at residential facilities and community nonprofits to create and implement plans to protect against elder sexual abuse.
SCAN Greater Richmond (Systems Change Grantee)	The Trauma Informed Community Network (TICN) in Virginia is a diverse group of professionals in the Greater Richmond area who are dedicated to supporting and advocating for continuous trauma informed care for all children and families within the Child Welfare system.
Shelter for Help in Emergency (Systems Change Grantee)	<p>The Greater Charlottesville Trauma Informed Community Network (GCTICN) will lead the ongoing development of Trauma Informed Leadership Teams (TIL Teams) in key systems and organizations.</p> <p>The TICN is working with Dr. Allison Jackson to provide the training and technical assistance necessary to create trauma informed systems and organizations.</p>
